

## Ordinance to prevent live stock from running at large.

The people of the town of Dundee Oregon do ordain as follows:

It shall be unlawful for the owner of, or any person having the care or control of any horses, cows, sheep swine, or other like animals, to permit such animals to run at large, out of his enclosure within the town limits or to herd same upon any street or alley or other public highway or upon property not enclosed, within the town limits. And any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof in the Recorder's Court, shall be fined not less than One Dollar and the necessary costs of prosecution, nor more than Twenty Dollars.

This ordinance shall be in effect on and after May 10, 1910.
