AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 53, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 318, AND ESTABLISHING A BASIS OF DETERMINING GOOD CREDIT FOR ESTABLISHING UTILITY SERVICES TO A CUSTOMER.

THE CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF DUNDEE, YAMHILL COUNTY, OREGON ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1. Section 2 of Ordinance No. 53 is hereby amended.** Paragraph 1 of Ordinance No. 53 is hereby deleted in its entirety. Paragraph 2 of Ordinance No. 53 in its first sentence is amended to read "That all of said cash deposits paid to the City of Dundee under provisions of this section will be credited by the City Administrator/Recorder to a separate account entitled, "Water Deposit Account, and the money shall be deposited into the **Water Fund** of said city.

**Section 2. Ordinance No. 318 repealed.** Ordinance No. 318 is hereby repealed.

**Section 3. Other References.** There is no reference to a deposit requirement in the Water Rate Resolution. (Resolution No. 97-13 or its attached Exhibit A (wtrrtpro)).

**Section 4. Water Utility Deposit.** The City Administrator/Recorder is granted the latitude to determine if a water utility deposit is required from a customer. This required deposit may apply to any customer of the water utility distribution system. The basis for such a determination shall be:

- a. The past delinquent utility payment history of the customer.
- b. Water service to a customer is discontinued for nonpayment of a delinquent bill.

The amount of a water utility deposit will be based upon the maximum amount of water used in a single utility billing period.

**Section 5. Customer Past Utility Payment History.** Any person requesting water utility service from the City may submit a statement from the most recent previous utility provider, in lieu of paying a water utility deposit to the City.

- 1. This statement will be on the official letter head of the water utility provider, bear the original signature of an official of the utility provider, and contain a date no earlier than 30 days prior to the date of the customer's request to the City.
- 2. This statement shall indicate that the person requesting utility service had a continuous, uninterrupted, up-to-date payment record; and left no outstanding balance with the previous utility provider.
- 3. This statement is applicable to only the person requesting utility service from the City of Dundee, and shall not apply to any other person other than the person making this request.

**Section 6. Deposit Application.** The City Administrator/Recorder may direct that any water utility deposit be applied against the final water utility bill of a customer.

**Section 7. Effective Date.** The effective date of this ordinance shall be 30 days from its adoption by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.
